

Understand Your Lodge

- Focus & Membership Social? Ritual? Enlightenment?
- Financial Position

Read all Lodge correspondence, petitions and bills presented for payment prior to the Communication.

Preserve peace and harmony. Rule with a fair hand.



Worshipful Master's Responsibilities Membership



Open on time & present an interesting program

- Provide Masonic Light
- Refreshments and enjoyable company.

Conduct Degrees with dignity and proficiency. All ceremonies require rehearsal.

Schedule and conduct those rehearsals.

Visit the ill, indisposed, aged and those upon whom misfortune has fallen.

Communication is KEY!

- A Master who works alone is doomed to Fail!
- Communicate your plans to all the Brethren



Worshipful Master's Responsibilities - District



- Attend all District functions
 - Masters & Wardens Associations
 - Visitations by the Grand Master
 - District Lodge of Instruction
 - Grand Lodge of Instruction
 - Official Visits to other Lodges.
 - ALL Summons of the Grand Master
- Divide and Conquer Use your Officers as Resources to attend in your stead
- Support Worshipful Masters of other Lodges
 - Travel together!
- Support your Grand Master, the Grand Staff and the DDGM
- Attend the Annual and Emergent Communications of the Grand Lodge.
 - It is a privilege and an obligation. Participate in the deliberations. Exercise the right to vote.

Make it Interesting and Short / Medium Length

Allow for Questions & Discussion

Wide & Varied Topics

- Lodge Interests
- Lodge Growth
- Get People Involved.

Masonic Education

- Appendant & Coordinate Bodies
- Grand Lodge topics
- Ample Discussion during and afterwards

The Working Tools ~ A Basic Budget



Develop a Budget prior to your year

- What do you want to Achieve? How much will it cost?
- Work with Secy, Treasurer & Immediate PM
- Voted on by the Brethren (January?)
- Keep Contingency!

What is the Lodge's Financial State at the start of your term?

Check at the Half way point – How are you doing?

Any changes needed in your plan? New Budget Items?

Its all about Balance!

- Earn a little...Spend a little...Save a little....

Leave the Lodge in a Better State When you Leave!

The Working Tools ~ Committees



You can't do everything yourself!

Identify focus areas in the Lodge

Form Committees to tackle each area

Identify members for the Committees

- Match skill of the member for the Committee
- Choose the Right People
 - Include a mix of new brothers and seasoned veterans
 - Give the committees a chance to try new things

Let the Committees do their Job

 Committees should give regular reports back to the WM and the Lodge.





Not another year!

Plan for Line Succession

 Make sure lower officers know what they will be responsible for in the future!

Keep the Momentum Flowing

 Work with your Wardens for long term health of your Lodge

Acknowledge that Life Happens

Have Backups





General Pointers

- 1. WM Must Evidence Enthusiasm for the Craft and the Lodge
 - If you are Early for meetings and activities, you are on-time!
- 2. Demonstrate support for Youth Programs that the Lodge supports
 - DeMolay and Rainbow will pay great dividends to the Craft with our support.
- Ask for Advice Make the Decisions Yourself!
 - Listen to everyone
- 4. You can't please everyone.
 - Do what you feel is right for yourself and the Lodge.
- 5. You will make mistakes. Learn from them and move on!
